## The Repertory Players Production Report 2015

Good morning Ladies and Gentlemen

13 productions were staged by the Repertory Players in 2015 and the theatres were used by no fewer than 23 other parties who hired the theatres for anything between 1 day and a week at a time. We managed to fill main stage for a total of about 34 weeks out of the year, while Theatre Upstairs was less utilised, with only 16 weeks being used. We are striving to improve the theatres' occupancy in 2016 as this goes a long way in keeping the theatre complex going, particularly in light of the fact that we can't put on as many of our own shows as we have in the past.

From a financial perspective, the highest grossing production was Oliver!, followed by Dirty Dancing. Both productions had large casts – in Oliver! a great proportion of which were under the age of 18, while Dirty Dancing attracted the late teens and young adults. We hope that this has given another generation a taste of what theatre is all about and that we will see more of them in future productions. In Theatre Upstairs, the most successful production was An Inspector Calls. The production was hugely successful with the schools audience as it is O Level set book for 2015-2017.

Come Together – A Beatles Cabaret and Music, Movies and Memories were not the successes we had hoped but they both contributed to cash flow through ticket sales and increased revenue in the bar, and for getting new folk involved in the theatre.

Reps hosted the National One Act Play Festival in 2015. We accommodated productions from Kadoma, Masvingo and Repteens. Repteens once again scooped the majority of the awards, winning 9 of the 14 trophies. Congratulations to all involved.
